


Appendix F
Anomaly Descriptions

Lot 1 Septic

Anomaly **N294.75 E193.2** was an oval-shaped stain measuring 28 by 24 cm and being brown (10YR5/3) in color. The stain first appeared at 30 cmbgs and the Apz/ B1 interface and extended to 34 cmbgs. In profile the stain was a shallow basin with no cultural material associated with it. This anomaly was located to the south of three lithic concentrations in the septic area and may be cultural.




Lot 1 Feature 2


Feature 2 was first identified during earlier Site Examination testing of Lot 1. This anomaly was located between the Lot 1 House, Lot 1 House New and Lot 1 Septic impact areas and would have been destroyed by subsequent development. It was decided to fully excavate this anomaly. After stripping the Apz to the B1 subsoil interface, Feature 2 was found to be oval-shaped stain measuring 140 by 150 cm and being dark brown (10YR3/3) in color. The stain first appeared at 30 cmbgs, the Apz/ B1 interface and extended to 98 cmbgs. In profile, the stain had gradually to steeply sloping sides and ended in an uneven floor with some deeper patches. Cultural material recovered consisted of chert, quartz and rhyolite debitage, charcoal, calcined bone, fire-cracked rock and brick with the majority of the material being recovered from the 30-55 cmbgs levels. This anomaly was interpreted as a natural tree hole that was used as a refuse disposal are or which had refuse wash into it. Fill 2 was yellowish brown (10YR5/8) in color and may represent a separate fill episode or may simply be an area where Fill 1 has leached into the surrounding subsoil resulting in a slightly darker color.

Plan at 30 cmbs




North Wall Profile



Anomaly **N303.6 E182.5** was a large irregularly-shaped stain measuring 10 by 7 meters and being brown (10YR5/3) in color. The stain first appeared at 30 cmbgs, the Apz/ B1 interface. In profile, the stain had several horizontal linear stains extending from it in all directions. Cultural material recovered consisted of one historic coin. This anomaly was interpreted as a large tree stump and root system stain.







Anomaly **N306.3 E185.4** was an oval-shaped stain measuring 64 by 30 cm and being dark gray (10YR4/1) in color. The stain first appeared at 30 cmbgs, the Apz/ B1 interface, and extended to 35 cmbgs. This anomaly was part of the much larger **N303.6 E182.5** tree root feature complex. In profile the stain was a thin smear of darker soil on the subsoil. Cultural material recovered consisted of quartz debitage. This anomaly was interpreted as a natural stain.







Anomaly **N307.15 E182.35** was an oval-shaped stain measuring 55 by 46 cm and being brown (10YR5/3) in color. This anomaly was part of the much larger **N303.6 E182.5** tree root feature complex. The stain first appeared at 30 cmbgs, the Apz/ B1 interface, and extended to 45 cmbgs. In profile the stain had shallowly sloping sides and a rounded bottom. No cultural material was recovered. This anomaly was interpreted as a shallow basin, probably natural in origin (although it did appear similar in shape and profile to other anomalies that were identified as cultural).



Anomaly **N308.4 E174.4** was a small round-shaped stain measuring 13 by 11 cm and being brown (10YR5/3) in color. The stain first appeared at 30 cmbgs, the Apz/ B1 interface, and extended to 50 cmbgs. In profile the stain had steeply sloped walls and eventually ran off to the west. No cultural material was recovered. This anomaly was interpreted as a prehistoric postmold.

Anomaly **N308.1 E174.7** was a small round-shaped stain measuring 11 cm in diameter and being brown (10YR5/3) in color. The stain first appeared at 30 cmbgs, the Apz/ B1 interface, and extended to 50 cmbgs. In profile the stain had steeply sloping walls and bifurcated at 50 cmbgs into two linear angled stains. No cultural material was recovered. This anomaly was interpreted as a prehistoric postmold.



Anomaly **N308.5 E175.63** was a tri-lobed-shaped stain measuring 146 by 87 cm and being dark grayish brown (10YR 4/2) in color. The stain first appeared at 30 cmbgs, the Apz/ B1 interface, and extended to 50 cmbgs. In profile the stain had gradually sloping sides tapering to a thin stain at the bottom. Cultural material recovered consisted of brick, quartz debitage, and historic ceramics. This anomaly was interpreted as a natural tree root stain similar to Lot 1 Feature 2.





Anomaly **N309.2 E172.3** was an oval-shaped stain measuring 40 by 25 cm and being brown (10YR5/3) in color. The stain first appeared at 30 cmbgs, the Apz/ B1 interface, and extended to 35 cmbgs. In profile the stain had steeply sloping sides and an irregularly shaped bottom. Cultural material recovered consisted of quartz debitage. This anomaly was interpreted as a shallow basin, possibly cultural or natural as a result of a larger cultural occupation.

Anomaly **N309.5 E172.65** was an oval-shaped stain measuring 37 by 30 cm and being brown (10YR5/3) in color. The stain first appeared at 30 cmbgs, the Apz/ B1 interface, and extending to 45 cmbgs. In profile the stain was steeply sloping sides, tapering to a small linear stain extending further into the subsoil. Cultural material recovered consisted of one piece of quartz debitage. This anomaly was interpreted as a shallow basin pierced by a Native post mold associated with House Form 1.





Anomaly **N309.2 E174.7** was a round-shaped stain measuring 25 by 28 cm and being brown (10YR5/3) in color with charcoal flecks. The stain first appeared at 30 cmbgs, the Apz/ B1 interface, and extended to 45 cmbgs. In profile the stain had steeply sloping sides and ended in a rock. No cultural material was recovered. This anomaly was interpreted as a post mold associated with House Form 1.





Anomaly **N310 E171.1** was an oval to round-shaped stain measuring 60 by 50 cm and being brown (10YR5/3) in color. The stain first appeared at 30 cmbgs, the Apz/ B1 interface, and extended to 50 cmbgs. In profile the stain had sides that gradually sloped into a narrow central vertical linear stain. Cultural material recovered consisted of quartz debitage and historic ceramics. This anomaly was interpreted as a shallow basin pierced by a Native post mold associated with House Form 1.







Anomaly **N310.7 E179.7** was an oval-shaped stain measuring 52 by 44 cm and being brown (10YR5/3) in color. The stain first appeared at 30 cmbgs, the Apz/ B1 interface, and extended to 35 cmbgs. In profile the stain was a shallow basin. Cultural material recovered consisted of quartz debitage. This anomaly was interpreted as a shallow basin.





Anomaly **N310.75 E182** was an oval-shaped stain measuring 66 by 95 cm and being dark greyish brown (10YR5/3) in color. This anomaly may be part of the much larger **N303.6 E182.5** tree root feature complex. The stain first appeared at 30 cmbgs, the Apz/ B1 interface, and extended to 40 cmbgs. In profile the stain had gradually sloping sides and a rounded bottom. Cultural material recovered consisted of one piece of quartz debitage. This anomaly was interpreted as a shallow basin that was a natural anomaly, similar in appearance to anomaly **N306.3 E185.4**.





Anomaly **N310.9 E170.4** was a square-shaped stain measuring 46 by 44 cm and being brown (10YR5/3) in color. The stain first appeared at 30 cmbgs, the Apz/ B1 interface, and extended to 45 cmbgs. In profile the stain had gradually sloping sides and a rounded bottom with a linear stain extending further below the main stain. Cultural material recovered consisted of one piece of redware. This anomaly was interpreted as a shallow basin pierced by a Native post mold associated with House Form 1.





Anomaly **N311.3 E169.5** was an amorphous-shaped stain measuring 100 by 50 cm and being brown (10YR5/3) in color. The stain first appeared at 30 cmbgs, the Apz/ B1 interface, and extended to 55 cmbgs. By 35 cmbgs most of the surrounding stain had disappeared and the anomaly had resolved itself into a 30 cm diameter round to oval shaped stain. In profile the stain had steeply sloping north side and gradually sloping south side and a flat bottom. Cultural material recovered consisted of chert, rhyolite and quartz debitage from the 35 to 40 cmbgs level. This anomaly was interpreted as a post mold associated with House Form 1 and an associated eroded area that was the result of a larger cultural occupation.



Anomaly **N311.8 E172.8** was a small oval-shaped stain measuring 18 by 12 cm and being brown (10YR5/3) in color. The stain first appeared at 30 cmbgs, the Apz/ B1 interface, and extended to 35 cmbgs. In profile the stain was a small shallow basin with gradually sloping sides and a flat bottom or possibly the base of a internal structural post. No cultural material was recovered. This anomaly was interpreted as a small basin or more likely a shallow internal structural post mold base





Anomaly **N312.15 E173.55** was an oval-shaped stain measuring 89 by 56 cm and being brown (10YR5/3) in color. The stain first appeared at 30 cmbgs, the Apz/ B1 interface, and extended to 50 cmbgs. In profile the stain appeared as two steeply sided pointed bottomed within a very rocky matrix. Cultural material recovered consisted of quartz and rhyolite debitage and coal ash. This anomaly was interpreted as a possible medium sized cache pit possibly resulting from a halted excavation of a pit when stones were encountered and the subsequent complete excavation of a pit adjacent to the obstructed one.



Anomaly **N313.55 E172.5** was an oval-shaped stain measuring 73 by 56 cm and being brown (10YR5/3) in color. The stain first appeared at 30 cmbgs, the Apz/ B1 interface, and extended to 35 cmbgs. In profile the stain had gradually sloping sides and an irregular shaped bottom. Cultural material recovered consisted of quartz debitage and a quartz crystal. This anomaly was interpreted as a shallow basin within House Form 1.







Anomaly **N314 E176** was an oval-shaped stain measuring 60 by 100 cm and being dark yellowish brown (10YR4/3) in color. The stain first appeared at 36 cmbgs, the Apz/ B1 interface and extended to 80 cmbgs. In profile the stain had steeply sloping sides and became very narrow after 50 cmbgs. Cultural material recovered consisted of brick. This anomaly was interpreted as a shallow basin pierced by a Native post mold associated with House Form 1.




Anomaly **N315 E73.65** was an roughly triangular shaped stain measuring 20 by 25 cm and being brown (10YR5/3) in color. The stain first appeared at 30 cmbgs, the Apz/ B1 interface and extended to 35 cmbgs. In profile the stain had steeply sloping sides and a flat bottom. No cultural material was recovered. This anomaly was interpreted as a shallow basin, possibly natural, but it was located within House Form 1.

Anomaly **N315.3 E173.25** was an roughly tri-lobed shaped stain measuring 30 by 45 cm and being brown (10YR5/3) in color. The stain first appeared at 30 cmbgs, the Apz/ B1 interface and extended to 35 cmbgs. In profile the stain had steeply sloping sides and a flat bottom. No cultural material was recovered. This anomaly was interpreted as a shallow basin, possibly natural, but it was located within House Form 1.

Cultural material recovered consisted of carbonized corn and corn cob fragments, many small quartz debitage, and charcoal. This anomaly was interpreted as a medium sized medium-depth cultural pit.

Anomaly **N297.2 E187.2** was an amorphous-shaped stain that emerged out of the impact area wall measuring 64 cm long and extending by 60 cm into the impact area. It appeared at 30 cmbgs, the Apz/B1 interface, and extending to 45 cmbgs. The stain was brown (10YR5/3) in color. In profile the stain had gently sloping walls and a undulating floor. Cultural material recovered consisted of calcined bone and quartz and rhyolite debitage from the 30 to 35 cmbgs level. This stain was interpreted as a medium sized shallow basin.



Anomaly **N298 E187.7** was an amorphous-shaped stain measuring 76 by 46 cm at 30 cmbgs, the Apz/B1 interface, and extending to 45 cmbgs. The stain was brown (10YR5/3) in color. In profile the stain had gently sloping walls and a undulating floor. Cultural material recovered consisted of Native pottery, charcoal, quartz debitage, a quartz crystal, calcined bone, and a machine-cut nail. This stain was interpreted as either natural stain, possibly floral or rodent in nature, or as a shallow basin subsequently impacted by natural processes.

Anomaly **N301.9 E184.8** was an oval-shaped stain measuring 65 by 82 cm at 30 cmbgs, the Apz/ B1 interface, and extending to 50 cmbgs. The stain was brown (10YR5/3) in color. In profile the stain had sides sloping at 45 degree extending to a pointed bottom. Cultural material recovered consisted of quartz and rhyolite debitage and Native pottery from the 30 to 35 cmbgs level. Several larger pieces of granite were present in and around the stain. 

Anomaly **N292.2 E214.5** was an oval-shaped stain measuring 132 by 98 cm at 34 cmbgs, the Apz/ B1 interface, and extending to 55 cmbgs. Anomaly N274.4 E210.3 was a round-shaped stain measuring 56 cm in diameter and being (10YR4/3) in color. The stain first appeared at 35 cmbgs, the Apz/ B1 interface, and extended to 65 cmbgs. In profile the stain had steeply sloping sides and a rounded bottom that was covered with larger cobbles. Cultural material recovered consisted of rhyolite and quartz debitage, fire-cracked rock, shell, calcined bone, and charcoal. This anomaly was interpreted as a medium-size, medium-depth cultural pit.




Anomalies **N278.2 E209.1**, **N279.3 E209.3**, and **N279.3 E210.3** were three post molds located separate from the other anomalies, just north of the center of the house impact area. They measured 15-20 cm in diameter and extended from 35 to between 40 and 55 cm below the A/B interface. Anomalies **N279.3 E209.3** and **N279.3 E210.3** were located one meter from each other while anomalies **N279.3 E209.3**, and **N278.2 E209.1** were located 1.4 meters apart and **N278.2 E209.1** and **N279.3 E210.3** were 1.6 meters from each other. Anomalies **N279.3 E209.3** and **N279.3 E210.3** both extended deeper than the remaining anomaly, having seven centimeter diameter squared to rounded end shafts extending into the subsoil. These deeper stains may represent either root stains or possibly deeper post molds that replaced the larger ones at some point. All the anomalies were brown (10YR5/3) in color and no artifacts were recovered. These stains are interpreted as possibly representing posts used to support a small watch platform in the maize field adjacent to the house to the southeast.

North Wall Profiles







Anomaly **N279.3 E203.3** was a round-shaped stain measuring 65 cm in diameter and being dark brown (10YR3/3) in color. The stain first appeared at 35 cmbgs, the Apz/ B1 interface, and extended to 55 cmbgs. In profile the stain had gradually sloping sides and ended in an angled vertical root stain. No cultural material was recovered but several large argillite cobbles and boulders were located around it in the B1 horizon. This anomaly was interpreted as a medium sized medium depth pit that was possibly impacted by rodent or root activity.



Anomaly **N280.75 E203.7** was an oval to round-shaped stain measuring 80 by 70 cm and being dark grayish brown (10YR3/2) in color. The stain first appeared at 30 cmbgs, the Apz/ B1 interface, and extended to 75 cmbgs. In profile the stain had a steeply sloping northern side and a gradually sloping southern side. Many rocks and cobbles were present. Cultural material recovered consisted of a machine-cut nail, quartzite, quartz, and rhyolite debitage, fire-cracked rock, one piece of unburned bone, and Native pottery, all from the upper 20 cm of the excavation. This anomaly was interpreted as a large sized medium depth pit similar to the pit from the Lot 2 Septic impact area.

Anomaly **N282 E204** was an oval to round-shaped stain measuring 90 by 80 cm and being mottled dark grayish brown and very dark brown (10YR3/2 and 10YR 2/2) in color. The stain first appeared at 30 cmbgs, the Apz/ B1 interface, and extended to 50 cmbgs. In profile the stain had gradually sloping sides and a large rock in the center. Cultural material recovered consisted of Native pottery, fire-cracked rock, and quartz debitage. This anomaly was interpreted as a shallow basin.
